Contemplative choral music will include the Thomas Tallis Short Service (Magnificat and Nunc dimittis), and the Women's Chorus will sing anthems by Francis Poulenc and 20th century composer Eleanor Daley. Hymns from the evening rite, including "The day thou gavest," will be sung by the congregation. Dr. David Ouzts will direct the choir, the Reverend Dr. Randy McCloy will officiate, and the Reverend Hester Mathes will celebrate the Eucharist.


A traditional service of readings and prayers that invite us to walk with our Lord in 'the way of the cross.'






Youth Book Study: The Alchemist




